So that they can be used in the service of others.



Friday 7 June 2024 Week 6 Term 2	Subject Selections Open Year 10 students are emailed with a link to the course selection website called WebChoice. This link will remain open until 7 June.
Thursday 6 June & Friday 7 June Week 6 Term 2	 Taster Lessons: Students attend taster lessons of courses they are interested in learning more about. The lessons allow for questions, address important information and provide some learning experiences that are reflective of the course content.
Friday 14 June 2024 Week 7	WebChoice link closes (8.45am). Students can still make changes through discussion with APT&L. Student/Parent/Carer will PRINT the Subject Selection Form once the selection is completed and submit the SIGNED form to Student Reception. By signing this form, the parent/caregiver is acknowledging Course costs and Course selections.
Week 8 Term 2	Year 11 2025 Interviews. Every student and their parent / carers attend an interview at the college, focused on looking at the suitability of students' course choices and eligibility for their intended pathway.

St Paul's Catholic Community Reconciliation Liturgy.

Jamie Pockran, Zoe Doyle, Cleo Doyle and Sienna McKibben, pictured below with Emeritus Professor John Maynard, were invited to perform recently at Lake Macquarie City Council for Reconciliation Week. The dance is a mix of contemporary and traditional Aboriginal styles, choreographed by Cleo. A real highlight was Cleo delivering the Acknowledgement of Country verbally and in sign language. Their dance followed an address from Prof. Maynard focused on his grandfather, Fred, the President of the Australian Aboriginal Progressive Association in the 1920s



Leading into Reconciliation Week, students enjoyed a visit to the Rising From the Embers Festival hosted by Wollutuka at the University of Newcastle. They were able to participate in a wide range of cultural activities and yarn with many members of the community. This excursion assisted our year 11 Aboriginal Studies students to learn about Aboriginal Identity and Heritage as well supporting our First Nations students connect with country and kin.





Markus Zusak Visit

Recently, international, best-selling (Australian!) author Markus Zusak visited St. Paul's to discuss his writing journey with English students from Years 10 to 12. Zusak is best known for his international bestselling novels, The Book Thief and The Messenger. Students participated in a range of writing workshops – and in the Year 10 workshop, of which I attended- he shared insight into his early life, career and how he has achieved his remarkable success. Markus shared with us an entertaining true-life anecdote, explaining why this story 'worked', and revealed the writing process he undertook for each of his novels. He then gave us time to write our own short paragraphs and those brave enough, shared them with the group. Markus generously allowed us the opportunity to ask him questions regarding his life as a writer and his interesting thoughts on the movie adaptation of The Book Thief. What is Variety's We Care - Therapy Grant?

Variety NSW/ACT We Care Therapy grant provides financial assistance towards therapy costs to assist children with a condition and are awaiting a diagnosis or are ineligible for NDIS support and require therapy. The grant is up to the value of \$2000 over a twelve-month period.

Applicants must be:

- 1. In NSW or ACT (citizenship or PR not required).
- 2. Between 0 to 18 years old.
- 3. Suspected or have a confirmed condition that is likely to require ongoing allied health and/or NDIS support, but do not qualify for NDIS, are waiting for a formal diagnosis, or have extenuating circumstances.

2024 School Fee Information

School fees comprise of Resource, Tuition, Diocesan Family School Building Levy (DFSBL), Camps/Retreats and Electives and are the responsibility of parents/carers of students enrolled at the school.

Tuition Fees Year 7-10 \$2033, Year 11-12 \$3089

The Diocesan Tuition Fee is set each year by the Diocese.

Family discount on full rate diocesan tuition fees is available to parents who have more than one child attending a Catholic School in this Diocese.

- 1 child family 0% full rate
- 2 child family 15% each child
- 3 child family 25% each child
- 4 + child family 50% each child

Concessions on Tuition fees are also given to account holders of a current Health Care/Pension card. An application form must be completed along with providing a copy of original card.

Diocesan Family & School Building Levy (DFSBL) \$1638

The DFSBL is charged to the oldest child for each family. The levy is pooled to contribute towards past, present and future costs for building projects across all existing schools, and for the development of new Catholic schools within the Diocese.

Resource Fees Year 7-10 \$860, Year 11-12 \$810

The resource costs are set by each individual school. Fees are used to pay school resources, educational activities, student textbooks, various low cost excursions/incursions, photocopying, computer technology and amenities.

Elective Fees Year 9-12

Students who choose to undertake specific subjects, will be required to pay additional charges per year to cover specific expenses associated with the individual subject.

Retreats/ Camps

The Year 7 & 9 Camp and 10 & 12 Retreat are compulsory, and it is expected that all students attend as per conditions of enrolment in a Catholic school. Costings are calculated based on all students attending, venues and buses have to be paid when booking is first made. Your understanding of this would be very much appreciated.

Friday Sport Payment & Consent

For your convenience, you can now consent and pay for your child's Friday sport through Compass each Term. The account holder (name on your statement) is the only one who can access Compass to make these payments, if you would like joint access to Compass so both parents can make payments please complete and return the attached joint access form.

The Catholic Schools Office declares that genuine inability to meet tuition and other fees does not exclude access to a school within the system by a child of a family genuinely committed to Catholic faith and practice.

For families experiencing financial hardship or wishing to discuss other payment arrangements please contact the College Principal or Finance Office to make an appointment. These discussions and arrangements regarding fees are strictly confidential.

The collection of all school fees is to ensure the best possible learning environment for your child.

Account Statements

All fees are billed yearly in February, and it is recommended a regular weekly, fortnightly or monthly instalment is made from February to November to ensure your account is fully paid by 30 November, 2024. Our preferred method of payment is via Bpay (BPay detail are on your monthly statement) however fees may also be paid via EFT, Credit card, cheque and Centrepay. If you require assistance with calculating your weekly, fortnightly or monthly payment amount, please email finance@booragul.catholic.edu.au

2024 School fee account can be viewed at any time through Compass and updated statement are emailed at the beginning of each month. Families who have a nil balance will not receive a statement.


